




Thursday, July 13, 2023

- HDR has completed Phase 1 "Data Collection and Review and District Interviews" of the Master Plan. Meeting this week to summarize the results. Phase 2 scoping is ongoing.
- Contracting and cost estimating for Backup Generator and Filters 5-8 almost complete will be brought to the Board in August for approval.
- Working with LSI Logic on scoping for continued PLC upgrades as well as Filter Automation.
- Stantec scoping for Plant rerating and testing for CDPHE approval.
- 40% reduction in historic water demands for June 2023 due to cool, wet weather.
- Successful treatment of 50/50 blend of Poudre/Horsetooth water for the last month. Staff continue to learn and document how to successfully treat more Poudre water.
- June 28, 2023 Coordinated with Water Resources staff to successfully treat 20 MGD of Poudre water for over 24 hours to convert a conditional water right to a permanent right.
- Fort Collin WTP Official response no more plant capacity for sale.
- Supervisors are attending a 2-day AWWA Leadership Academy training next week at Fort Collins WTP.
- Re-implementing bi-annual Performance Reviews for Plant staff.

ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR SOLDIER CANYON FILTER PLANT 67 MGD RE-RATING SCOPE OF WORK

General: This Scope of Work describes the services to be provided under the DESIGN SERVICES AGREEMENT for the Soldier Canyon Filter Plant Re-Rating Project between the Soldier Canyon Water Treatment Authority (AUTHORITY) and Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. (ENGINEER). ENGINEER shall mean "Stantec Consulting Services, Inc., its Parent company and its affiliates and subsidiaries."

The scope is divided into Hourly Rate tasks and subtasks, which describe the required work for the management and evaluation of the Soldier Canyon Filter Plant Expansion Feasibility Study Project. The period of performance is through May 31, 2024. Project schedule dates are provided based on estimated task completion dates. The total estimated fee for this SOW is provided in the Project Work Breakdown Structure (Attachment 1).

TASK 1 SCFP RE-RATE ANALYSIS AND DEMONSTRATION

Objectives: The objective of this task is to perform analysis on the backwash system and perform bench-scale testing, develop a detailed testing plan and schedule for the high-rate filter and pretreatment (flocculation and sedimentation) demonstration testing, as well as to define any equipment needs. The test logistics and operating conditions/requirements will be discussed with SCFP staff initially to develop the draft Test Plan, and then the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) Water Quality Control Division will be presented with the draft plan for its review. Additional support will be provided by Engineer for high-rate pilot filter testing parameters prior to full-scale demonstration approval to help expedite transition to and start of full-scale demonstration.

- ENGINEER (up to 4 staff) will conduct onsite meetings with the SCFP operations staff to discuss operations, solicit feedback on the current performance of the plant, testing goals and objectives and confirm operational criteria for increase flow rate. Site duration is estimated as two (2), eight (8)- hour days. Some of the issues to be discussed include:
 - Overall schedule for completing test plan, schedule for completing filter tests (pilot and full-scale), and schedule for completing final report
 - Relationship between testing activities related to the proposed SCFP expansion projects
 - Staffing requirements and who will perform daily O&M
 - Filtration rates and filters to be tested, and for what duration
 - Testing data collection and management
 - Laboratory testing requirements, including on-site and off-site tests (if required)
 - Establish clear lines of communication between Engineer and Owner
- 2) ENGINEER will evaluate capacity for the backwash system for expansion to 67 mgd and update the SCFP Expansion Feasibility Report accordingly.

Deliverables:

- Expansion Study (update) draft and final
- CDPHE Re-rate application submittal
- Workshop agenda and deliverables

Task 2 CDPHE COORDINATION AND SUBMITTAL

1) ENGINEER (up to 2 staff) will conduct up to two (2) meetings with CDPHE to discuss project and confirm submittal requirements to rerate SCFP from 60 mgd to at least 65 mgd. Meetings will be held virtually with 1-hour duration.

- 2) ENGINEER will prepare a submittal application to CDPHE to rerate SCFP from 60 mgd to at least 65 mgd. Engineer will modify existing design drawings and reports as the basis for the CDPHE submittal. The following are estimated requirements for the submittal per CDPHE Table A-1, Design Review Matrix:
 - Water Quality Data
 - Process Flow Diagram
 - Hydraulic Profile
 - Capacity Evaluation and Design Calculations
 - Residuals Plan
 - Operation's Plan
 - Security Plan
 - Drawings and specifications
- 3) ENGINEER will respond to questions by CDPHE on Re-rate submittal as requested by CDPHE to obtain approval for SCFP to be re-rated to at least 65 mgd.

Task 3 Project Management and Coordination

Objectives: The objective of this task is to manage the work elements and provide communication with the AUTHORITY.

- 1) ENGINEER will prepare project setup documentation including contract, safety forms, project management plan. ENGINEER will retain and file project documents, meeting notes, site visit notes, workshop notes, and pertinent administrative files in electronic format using Microsoft Teams.
- 2) ENGINEER will facilitate up to six (6) project meetings with AUTHORITY staff. It is assumed that all project meetings will be virtual as a Microsoft Teams meetings, 30-minutes in duration, and attended by one ENGINEER representative.
 - a) Prepare and coordinate distribution of meeting agendas and meeting notes.
- 3) ENGINEER will facilitate monthly internal coordination meetings with staff. It is assumed that these meetings will be one (1)-hour in duration and attend up to 4 project staff and held virtually. It is assumed a total of 8 meetings.
- 4) ENGINEER will attend up to two (2) monthly AUTHORITY Board meetings. It is assumed that the Board meeting will be in person held at the Soldier Canyon Filter Plant and be 1 hour in length and attend by one ENGINEER representative.
- 5) ENGINEER will prepare and submit monthly progress reports to the AUTHORITY with the monthly invoice and will include:
 - Summary of activities completed during the previous billing period.
 - Monthly invoice.

Assumptions:

- Estimate includes expenses at cost and mileage is charged based on IRS Rate.
- The AUTHORITY will review the draft Technical Memorandum and provide comments within 15 working days.
- All reports, technical memoranda, PIP, QMP, invoices, and permitting documents shall be delivered electronically.
- ENGINEER shall be entitled to reasonably rely upon the information and data provided by the AUTHORITY or obtained from generally acceptable sources within the industry without independent verification except to the extent such verification is expressly included in the Scope of Services.

- ENGINEER will perform independent quality control/assurance reviews in accordance with the QA/QC plan for each deliverable, prior to submission. The quality control reviews are included with each task.
- ENGINEER assumes use of 2021 SCFP Expansion Plant record drawings with modifications, as needed, to include in the CDPHE submittal. Full plant drawing update is not included in the scope.
- ENGINEER will submit the rerate application and request approval by CDPHE but does not guarantee approval is granted.
- ENGINEER will commence work upon receipt of requested data.
- ENGINEER will not complete a demonstration plan for full-scale operation of unit processes at the rerate flow rate.

SCHEDULE

The preliminary schedule to complete this amendment is summarized below. The goal is to begin high-rate pilot filtration testing shortly after notice to proceed. Final approval from CDPHE is expected after this date. The contract will be extended through May 32, 2024. The major milestones for the schedule are:

- NTP (August 23)
- Conduct site visit (August 23)
- Submit draft updated evaluation report to AUTHORITY (October 23)
- Draft Re-rate Application to AUTHORITY (November 23)
- Submit Re-rate Application to CDPHE (December 23)
- CDPHE Review (3/4 months)

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SOLDIER CANYON WATER TREATMENT AUTHORITY CREATION AGREEMENT

THIS SOLDIER CANYON WATER TREATMENT AUTHORITY CREATION AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 20th day of October 2016, by and among EAST LARIMER COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, FORT COLLINS-LOVELAND WATER DISTRICT, and NORTH WELD COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, each of which are quasi-municipal corporations and political subdivisions of the State of Colorado, operating pursuant to Article 1, Title 32, C.R.S.

RECITALS

A. The Parties are each water districts located collectively within Larimer and Weld Counties, and authorized to supply and supplying water as authorized by statute for domestic and other public and private purposes by means of reservoirs, treatment works and facilities, equipment, and appurtenances incident thereto, and as typically provided by a water district.

B. Article XIV, Section 18(2)(a) of the Constitution of the State of Colorado and Part 2, Article 1, Title 29, C.R.S., encourage and authorize intergovernmental agreements for the joint and cooperative provision of public services.

C. Section 29-1-204.2, C.R.S., authorizes the Parties to establish, by contract, a separate governmental entity, to be known as a water authority, to be used by the Parties to affect the development of water resources, systems, or facilities in whole or in part for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parties or others.

D. The Parties have previously entered into numerous contractual agreements and cooperative arrangements to jointly provide for the construction, operation, maintenance, and expansion of the Treatment Facility as defined below, and the creation of a separate legal entity pursuant to Section 29-1-203, C.R.S., named the Soldier Canyon Filter Plant, to manage the Treatment Facility, such agreements including but not limited to the Intergovernmental Agreement, dated March 29, 1990, the Amended Intergovernmental Agreement, dated December 1995, the First Addendum To Amended Intergovernmental Agreement, dated April 21, 1998, and the Second Addendum To Amended Intergovernmental Agreement, dated September 20, 2005.

E. The Parties, because of their long standing, effective, and efficient cooperative arrangements to jointly provide for water treatment, and the success of the Soldier Canyon Filter Plant in managing the Treatment Facility, wish to achieve the additional public benefits associated with the creation of a water authority to succeed to the role of the Soldier Canyon Filter Plant.

F. Because of necessary revisions to the Creation Agreement Effective February 1, 2017 ("Original Creation Agreement"), the Parties have Amended and Restated the Original Creation Agreement effective April 16, 2019, and *Month Day* 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

I. <u>Definitions</u>. As used in this Agreement, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

A. <u>Act.</u> Shall mean Article 45.1, Title 37, C.R.S.

B. <u>Agreement</u>. Shall mean this Soldier Canyon Water Treatment Authority Creation Agreement.

C. <u>Amended IGA</u>. Shall mean the Amended Intergovernmental Agreement, dated December 1995, between the Parties, as amended by the First Addendum to Amended Intergovernmental Agreement, dated April 21, 1998, and the Second Addendum to Amended Intergovernmental Agreement, dated September 20, 2005.

D. <u>Authority</u>. Shall mean the Soldier Canyon Water Treatment Authority created by this Agreement.

E. <u>Authority Obligations</u>. Shall mean revenue bonds, notes or other financial obligations issued by the Authority payable from its Net Revenues or from any other available funds of the Authority.

F. <u>Board of Directors</u>. Shall mean the Board of Directors of the Authority.

G. <u>Debt Service Component</u>. Shall mean that portion of rates and charges paid to the Authority by North Weld and ELCO for Treated Water necessary for payment of Authority Obligations. Revenues associated with the Debt Service Component are a portion of the Net Revenues of North Weld and ELCO, as such term is defined in resolutions of such parties relating to the issuance of revenue bonds. Any Debt Service Component shall not be an Operation and Maintenance Expense of North Weld or ELCO and such Debt Service Component shall be paid from the Net Revenues of North Weld and ELCO contemporaneously with their payment of Existing Party Debt.

H. <u>Director</u>. Shall mean a member of the Board of Directors of the Authority.

I. <u>ELCO</u>. Shall mean the East Larimer County Water District.

J. <u>Existing Party Debt</u>. Shall mean, with respect to ELCO, its Water Enterprise Revenue Bonds, Series 2009A and Water Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2009B, and with respect to North Weld, its Loan Agreement with the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority, dated as of September 1, 2009, and its Water Enterprise Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2012, which obligations are existing at the time of the execution of this Agreement.

K. <u>Fort Collins-Loveland</u>. Shall mean the Fort Collins-Loveland Water District.

L. <u>Governing Board</u>. Shall mean the Board of Directors acting as the Governing Board of the Water Activity Enterprise.

Gross Revenues. Shall mean all fees (including, but not limited to, M. user fees and plant investment fees), charges, and revenues directly or indirectly derived by the Authority for the services furnished by, or use of, the Treatment Facility, or any part thereof, or from the sale or provision of Treated Water, including all income attributable to any future dispositions of property or rights related to contracts, settlements, or judgments held or obtained in connection with the System or its operations; provided however, that there shall be excluded from Gross Revenues: (i) moneys borrowed and used for providing Treatment Facility Capital Improvements; (ii) any money and securities, and investment income therefrom, in any refunding fund, escrow account, or similar account pledged to the payment of any bonds or other obligations for the purpose of defeasing the same; (iii) any moneys received as grants or appropriations from the United States, the State of Colorado, or other sources, the use of which is limited or restricted by the grantor or donor to the provision of Treatment Facility Capital Improvements or for other purposes resulting in the general unavailability thereof, except to the extent any such moneys shall be received as payments for the use of the Treatment Facility, services rendered thereby, the availability of any such service, or the disposal of any commodities therefrom; and (iv) any revenue received from North Weld or ELCO which constitutes the Debt Service Component.

N. <u>Gross Revenues Fund</u>. Shall have the meaning given to it in Section V.D.1. of this Agreement.

O. <u>Net Revenues</u>. Shall mean the Gross Revenues remaining after the payment of the Operation and Maintenance Expenses.

P. <u>North Weld</u>. Shall mean the North Weld County Water District.

Q. <u>Operation and Maintenance Expenses</u>. Shall mean all reasonable and necessary current expenses of the Authority, paid or accrued, for operating maintaining, and repairing the Treatment Facility, including any Treatment Facility Improvements and any Treatment Facility Expansion, including without limitation legal and overhead expenses of the Authority directly related to the administration of the Treatment Facility, any Treatment Facility Improvements or Treatment Facility Expansion; provided however, that there shall be excluded from Operation and Maintenance Expenses any allowance or transfers for depreciation, payments in lieu of taxes or franchise fees, legal liabilities not based on contract, expenses incurred in connection with Treatment Facility Capital Improvements, and charges for accumulation of reserves.

R. <u>Operation and Maintenance Component</u>. Shall mean that portion of rates and charges paid to the Authority by Parties for Treated Water necessary for payment of Operation and Maintenance Expenses. Revenues associated with the Operation and Maintenance Component are a portion of the Gross Revenues.

S. <u>Operation and Maintenance Fund</u>. Shall have the meaning given to it in Section V.D.2. of this Agreement.

T. <u>Party or Parties</u>. Shall mean ELCO, Fort Collins-Loveland, and North Weld, individually or collectively.

U. <u>Soldier Canyon Filter Plant</u>. Shall mean the separate legal entity established by the three (3) Parties pursuant to the provisions of C.R.S. §29-1-203 and the Amended IGA.

V. <u>Steering Committee</u>. Shall mean the governing body of the Soldier Canyon Filter Plant.

W. <u>System</u>. Shall mean the water distribution lines, improvements, facilities, and system of each Party. The System does not include the Treatment Facility, the Treatment Facility Expansion, or the Treatment Facility Improvements.

X. <u>TABOR</u>. Shall mean Article X Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution.

Y. <u>Treated Water</u>. Shall mean the potable water treated by the Treatment Facility or otherwise supplied by the Authority and intended primarily for domestic consumption.

Z. <u>Treatment Capacity</u>. Shall mean the total volume of water which may be treated by the Treatment Facility during a twenty-four (24) hour period of time for the benefit of all three (3) Parties during the usual and ordinary operation thereof. Treatment Capacity may vary, from time to time, based on a number of reasons including, but not limited to, changes in State or federal law, operational changes, and Treatment Facility Expansions.

AA. <u>Treatment Capacity Share</u>. Shall mean a Party's pro rata ownership of the Treatment Capacity based on its funding of the capital costs of the Treatment Facility, as provided in Sections VIII.B. and C.

BB. <u>Treatment Facility</u>. Shall mean the water filtration plant located at 4424 LaPorte Avenue, Fort Collins, Colorado 80521, together with the real property, easements, water distribution lines, master meters, improvements and other facilities, assets and property associated therewith, which are jointly owned and used by the Parties or the Soldier Canyon Filter Plant in the treatment and distribution of potable water to the respective Treated Water transmission and distribution systems of each Party, and which is being transferred to the Authority, pursuant to Section VII.A. of this Agreement. Existing assets include, but are not limited to, real property, personal property, improvements, buildings, furniture, appliances, supplies, plans, tools, vehicles, apparatus, mobile equipment, machinery, intangible personal property, cash, bank accounts, insurance policies, leases, accounts receivable, warranties, guarantees, indemnifications, licenses, permits, contracts, and agreements.

1. Raw Water Transmission Facilities. With respect to raw water transmission and intake facilities, the term "Treatment Facility" includes:

a. The 42-inch diameter raw water transmission line from the outlet at the Soldier Canyon Dam at Horsetooth Reservoir, up to the water filtration plant and including the meter thereon, such transmission line being located on real property owned by the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, and licensed to the Parties by that certain "License for Installation of Raw Water Transmission Line Below Soldier Canyon Dam", dated June 15, 1978; and

b. The 42-inch diameter raw water transmission line (constructed in 2021) from Northern Water's 54-inch pipeline from Horsetooth Reservoir, up to the water filtration plant, such transmission line being located on real property owned by the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, and licensed to the Parties by that certain "Grant of a permanent easement to construct, operate, and maintain a domestic water system", dated September 30, 2020.

c. The 42-inch diameter raw water transmission line that delivers raw water from the Pleasant Valley Pipeline from and including the valve located east of the Treatment Facility in the Pleasant Valley Pipeline right-of-way to the water filtration plant.

d. The Authority's ownership share in the PVP Sedimentation Basin and Screen identified in the agreement "Agreement between the City of Fort Collins and the Soldier Canyon Water Treatment Authority regarding the Pleasant valley Pipeline Munroe Turnout Screen and Sedimentation Basin, dated *Month Day, 2023.* The percent ownership of these facilities, per District, is listed below:

2. Treated Water Transmission Facilities. With respect to Treated Water discharge and transmission facilities, the term "Treatment Facility" includes all Treated Water transmission lines from the water filter plant to and including the first meters thereon, or the boundary of the water filter plant property, whichever comes first.

CC. <u>Treatment Facility Expansion</u>. Shall mean the improvement, enhancement or expansion of the Treatment Facility for the purpose of increasing the Treatment Capacity of the Treatment Facility, as determined by the Board of Directors.

DD. <u>Treatment Facility Capital Improvements</u>. Shall mean Treatment Facility Improvements and Treatment Facility Expansion, including the acquisition of land, easements, facilities, and equipment (other than ordinary repairs and replacements) which are incorporated into the Treatment Facility.

EE. <u>Treatment Facility Improvements</u>. Shall mean the improvement or enhancement of the Treatment Facility which does not increase Treatment Capacity but which is intended to improve the efficiency of the Treatment Facility and/or quality of Treated Water from the Treatment Facility, as determined by the Board of Directors.

FF. <u>Valuation Date</u>. Shall mean the 120th day following the day written notice is given, pursuant to Section X.C. of this Agreement, of a Party's intent to withdraw from this Agreement.

GG. <u>Water Activity or Water Activities</u>. Shall have the meaning set forth in Section 37-45.1-102(3), C.R.S.

HH. <u>Water Activity Enterprise</u>. Shall mean the Water Activity Enterprise established by Article VI of this Agreement.
